Tenant Profile - Sun Holdings



Guillermo Perales stated his career in 1994. As the peso devalued, and lending in Mexico dried up, he convinced Golden Corral to give him the development rights for Dallas, Texas, the only



franchise market they had available. They agreed, and he was given a five-store deal. With this deal, Perales was able to emigrate to the United States, where he worked with the Small Business Administration to secure funding for his restaurants.

In 1997, Perales opened his first restaurant in Richardson,

Texas. Since then, he has grown his company, and has become the eighth-largest franchisee in

the country, with nearly 800 stores. He is also the largest Latin franchisee. His company, Sun Holdings, employs 17,000 people, and ranks among the largest franchisees in 8 different concepts: Arby's, Burger King, Cici's Pizza, GNC, Krispy Kreme, Popeyes, and T- Mobile.

GNC is Perales' most recent franchise expansion. In
2016, Sun Holdings spent \$17 million on the purchase
of 84 GNC stores, in the Austin and Dallas MSAs.
Perales has plans to build 30 more by 2020, but
believes it will be done sooner.

2016 sales came close to \$700 million, and in 2017,
the company is on track to add an additional 150 stores in multiple concepts, 50
through acquisition, and opening 100 new stores.


Number of Locations by Concept

Victoria is a city in the state of Texas, United States and it is the county seat of Victoria County. Victoria is located thirty miles inland from the Gulf of Mexico. The city is named for General Guadalupe Victoria, who became the first president of independent Mexico. The city is a regional hub for a seven-county area known as the "Golden Crescent" and serves a retail trade area of over 250,000 people. Victoria is known as "The Crossroads" because of its location within a two-hour drive of Corpus Christi, Houston, San Antonio and Austin. The city is home to the University of Houston–Victoria and Victoria College.

Victoria's economy is a mix of education, health, retail, agriculture and industry. Its access to major highways, the Victoria Regional Airport, railway terminals, the shallow draft Port of Victoria, and the deep water Port of Port Lavaca-Point Comfort help to sustain a healthy environment for business. Major industrial employers in the region include Formosa Plastic, the Inteplast Group, Dow, Invista and Alcoa. In 2012, Caterpillar Industries invested \$200 million to build a 1.1 million square foot hydraulic excavator manufacturing facility in Victoria that employs approximately 500 people.

Victoria's 562-acre (2.27 km2) Riverside Park is home to the Texas Zoo which houses more than 200 species of animals and plants that are indigenous to Texas, exhibiting them in their natural habitat. The park is also home to more than fifteen baseball fields which are occupied during the spring and summer by teams from the Victoria Metro region. Also in Riverside park on the Guadalupe River there is the Victoria Paddling trail. This 4.2 mile stretch of the Guadalupe River is bordered by scenic soft banks rather than the limestone bluffs of the Hill Country.
