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
Location Overview



The subject investment property is situated along Cane Run Road, which serves as an access road and intersects with Interstate 264. Cane Road boasts average daily traffic counts of approximately 44,000 vehicles and Interstate 264, which brings an additional 63,000 vehicles into the immediate area on average daily and leads to downtown Louisville. There are more than 67,000 individuals residing within a three-mile radius of the property and more than 193,000 individuals within a five-mile radius.

The subject property benefits from being well-positioned in a highly dense retail corridor consisting of national and local tenants, shopping centers, national sports complexes, theme parks and hospitality accommodations all within close proximity of this property. Major national tenants include: McDonald's, Save-a-Lot, PNC Bank, Waffle House, Rite Aid, KFC, Family Dollar, Speedway, UPS, Roses and several other quick service restaurants. This property also benefits from being situated within a three-mile radius of Kentucky Kingdom, a 63-acre park which includes a collection of amusement rides and a water park named Hurricane Bay. Additionally, this Wendy's is less than three miles away from Louisville International Airport, where almost 4 million passengers and over 5 billion pounds of cargo travel through annually. Many notable academic institutions are within close proximity of the subject property, most significantly University of Louisville, a public university in Louisville, Kentucky, and a member of the Kentucky state university system, which enrolls over 22,000 students and over 2,000 faculty members.

Louisville, Kentucky's largest city, sits on the Ohio River along the Indiana Border. Louisville is the county seat of Jefferson County and has a metro population of roughly 1,284,848.
