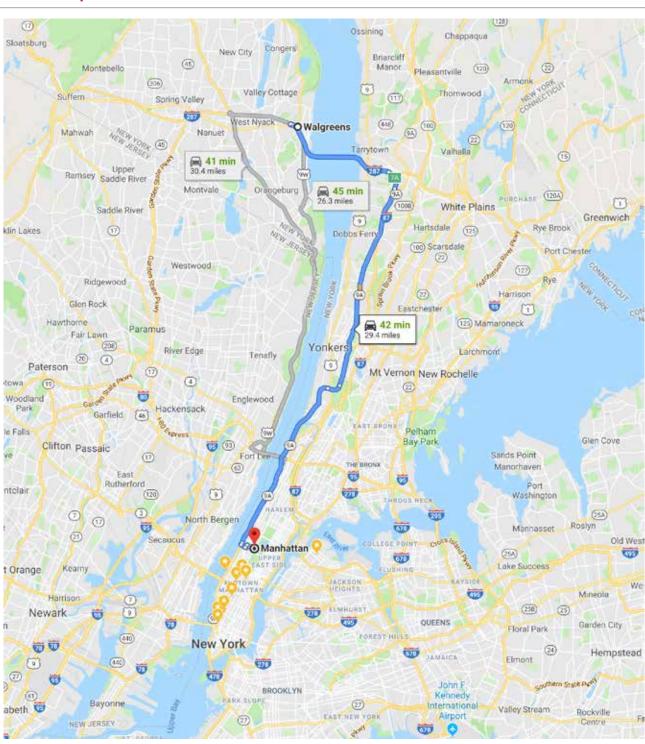
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Regional Map



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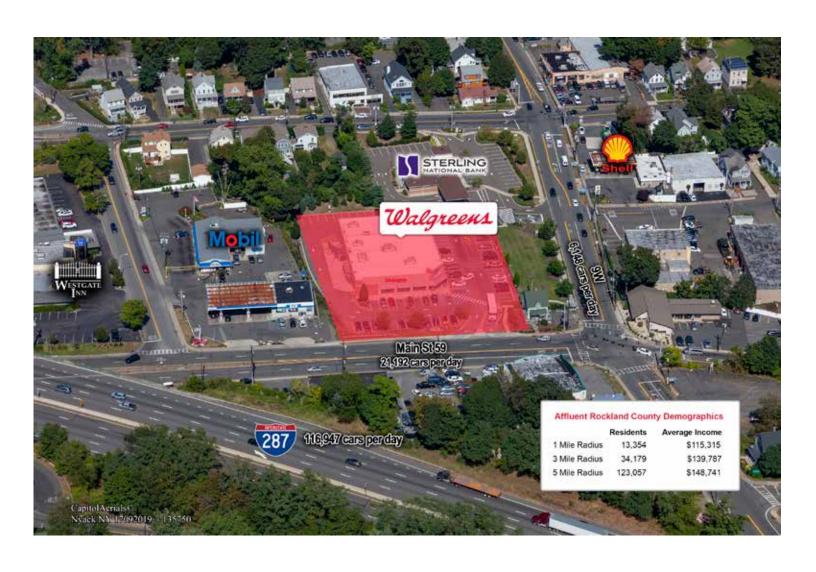


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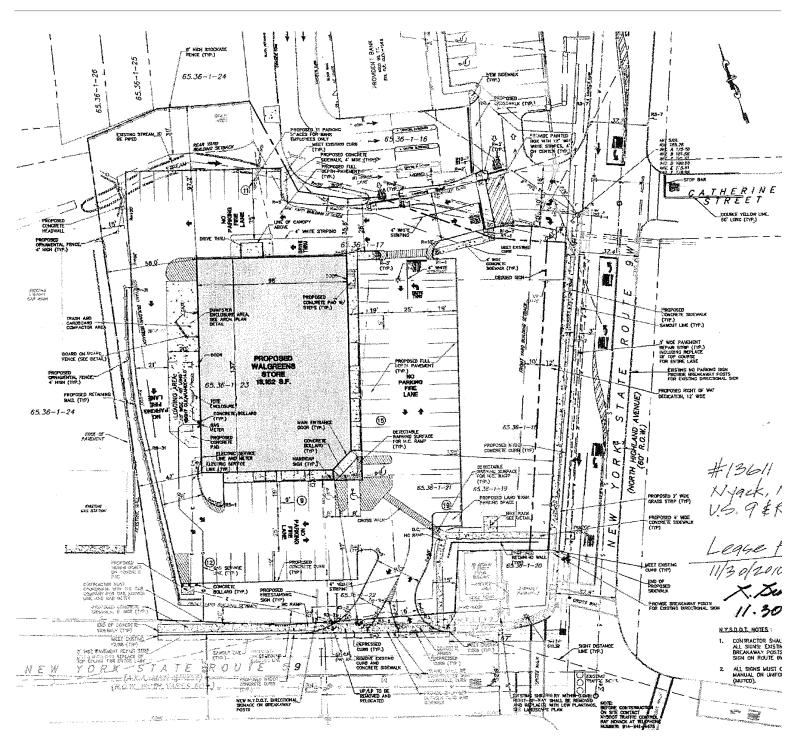

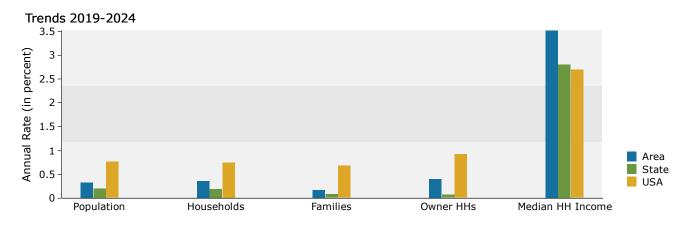
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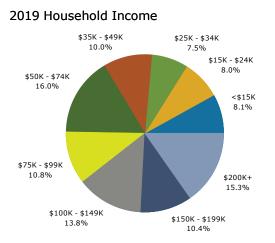


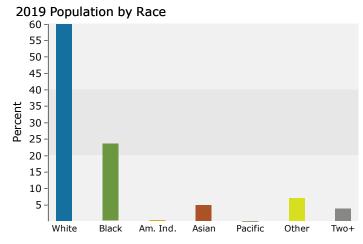


Demographics - 1 Mile Radius

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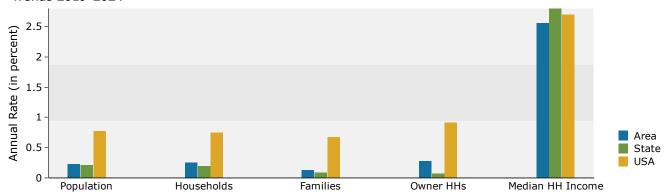
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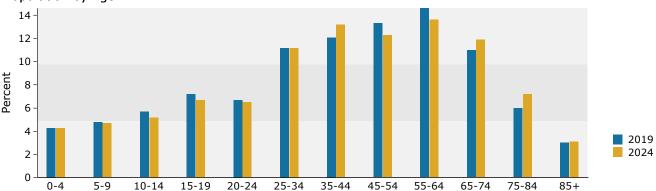


Demographics - 3 Mile Radius

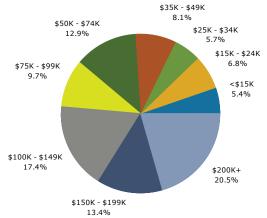




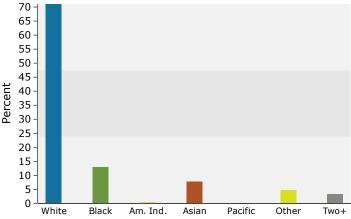
Population by Age

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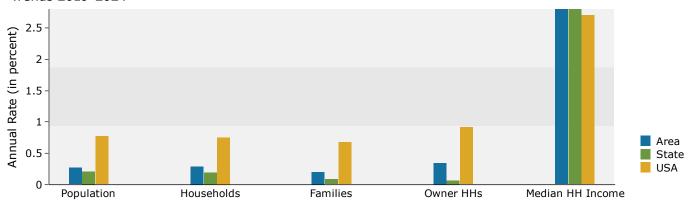
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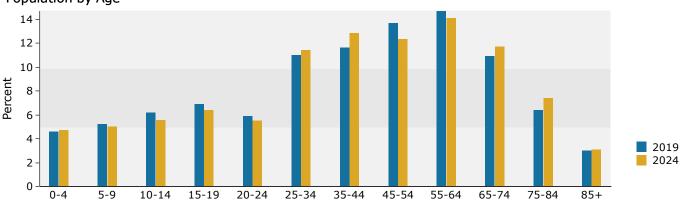


Demographics - 5 Mile Radius

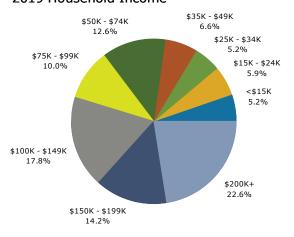




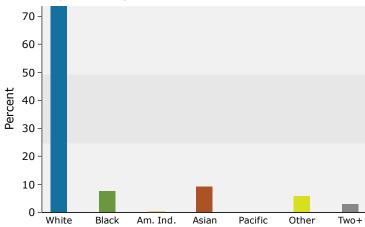
Population by Age
