





Heartland Dental is the nation's largest dental support organization providing non-clinical, administrative support services to 2,300 dentists in nearly 1,400 offices across 38 states. Heartland Dental partners with its supported dentists to deliver high-quality care across the full spectrum of dental services, offering continuing professional education and leadership training along with a variety of non-clinical, administrative services including staffing, human resources, procurement, financial, marketing, and information technology.

Heartland Dental was founded in 1997 by Rick Workman, DMD, who opened his first two dental offices in Effingham, Illinois. Dr. Rick Workman experienced the difficulties faced by dentists firsthand, figuring out how to balance spending 50 hours a week at the dental chair, working 25+ hours on business aspects, as well as making time for his family. In 1982, Dr. Workman began his tenure in dental support as a solution to help his peers deal with balancing dental care and managing administrative tasks. In 1997, Heartland Dental was officially established with the goal of offering dentists the freedom to focus on their craft. This resonated with industry professionals, and Heartland Dental has continued to grow.

Heartland Dental has been included on the Inc. 5000 list of the fastest-growing private companies in the U.S. a total of 7 times, a feat achieved by less than a tenth of Inc. 5000 honorees. In 2018, KKR, a leading global investment firm, acquired the majority interest in the company, becoming a significant partner. The company had a reported \$1.6 billion in net patient service revenue in 2019.

ECONOMY


- Low business energy costs, low corporate income taxes, skilled workers, and a location within 20 miles of a vibrant major city makes the Belton area a great place for businesses to relocate or expand
- The largest employment sectors of the city's diverse economy include retail trade (12.9%), health care and social assistance (12.6%), accommodation and food services (9.8%), and manufacturing (8.7%)
 - Other key sectors in the region include bioscience, financial and professional services, energy solutions, health sciences, information technology, and transportation and logistics
- 10 miles south of "Three Trails Crossing," the confluence of major interstates 1-49, 1-435, and 1-470
- 12,500 comprise the labor force; 3.9% unemployment rate in the region
- Largest employers include Belton School District (687), Quick n' Tasty (600), Belton Regional Medical Center (360), Hy-Vee (270), ADESA (250), Price Chopper (205), and Safe Fleet (250)

- Chewy Fulfillment Center An 800,000 square foot e-commerce fulfillment center for the online retailer that was completed in August 2021; expected to create 1,600 new jobs long term
- Southview Commerce Center NorthPoint Development has approval to build a 4th building expected to cost \$30 million at the Southview Commerce Center
- The Encore A \$44 million project to build 322 luxury apartments on an 11-acre parcel
- Center 301 Apartments A \$34 million multi-family housing complex with 306 units and amenities
- Autumn Ridge A housing project to include 147 single-family homes with a neighborhood playground
