

KinderCare files again for IPO after postponing in November

KinderCare Learning (NYSE:KLC) refiled for an initial public offering after the company abruptly pulled the plug on its original offering one day before the stock had been set to begin trading.

KinderCare on Wednesday filed an amended S-1 after originally filing an S-1 in October. The childcare provider postponed its **IPO in November**, citing regulatory concerns out of the company's control. KinderCare filed in October to go public 16 years after a **\$1B buyout**. Founded in 1969, KinderCare bills itself as **America's largest childcare provider** in terms of capacity at its centers.

"KinderCare originally said it planned to sell 25.8M shares at a price of \$18 to \$21/share."

The company again said it plans to list on the New York **Stock Exchange** under the ticker symbol "KLC," but provided few other details. For example, the firm didn't disclose how many shares it intends to offer or an **expected price range** for the deal.

Barclays, Morgan Stanley, Jefferies, BofA Securities, Goldman Sachs, Baird, Citi, Credit Suisse, and Macquarie Capital are listed as the **joint bookrunners on the deal**.





Located just 12 miles outside of Lynchburg, the rural community of Forest, Virginia, offers a natural setting for its residents.


Forest is home to a small community of people who enjoy a rural day-to-day lifestyle, while still maintaining access to the convenience and attractions of a larger city.

Lynchburg is a city of 50 square miles located near the geographic center of the state, bordered by the eastern edge of the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains.

Lynchburg City Council gathers to cast its vision for the Hill City

The Lynchburg City Council spent Thursday casting a vision for the future of the Hill City. They gathered for their annual retreat before working on the 2023 budget. Lynchburg City Manager, Wynter Benda, said this was a vision and strategy retreat.

"What we **centered in** on and what we should be looking for is our north star as far as where we want to go as a city, and I think today we took that first step," Benda said. Vice Mayor Beaux Wright says his **goal** today was to listen and walk away with an idea of what they want to do for Lynchburg in the next **10 to 20 years**.

What we talked a lot about today was how do we -- let's say we want Lynchburg to be a community for young people and families, right, our median age is what, a little less than 30, and so how are making a community that's going to be attractive and resilient for families that are just getting started here in Lynchburg today.

He says that includes making sure that the city has high-quality public education, a well-resourced public **safety force** and great infrastructure.

The city brought in officials with SIR, a business consultancy, to facilitate the discussions. Part of the retreat included discussing the city's strengths and weaknesses.

Mayor MaryJane Dolan believes the **city's leadership** is strong, but a concern of hers is having the resources necessary to move the city forward.

We have to really invest in our infrastructure, invest in our citizens, invest in our neighborhoods," Dolan said.

Wright praised city employees but says it's important that they invest in public education.



Bedford County ranked #10 in state for population growth over past decade, census says

New census data shows Bedford County experienced tremendous population growth over the **last 10 years**


Bedford County saw significant growth in the last 10 years. It ranked #10 out of 133 Virginia localities based on the highest population change, according to new census data.
