PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

For sale to qualified investors is the fee simple interest in a corporate P.F. Chang's located in Toledo, Ohio. P.F. Chang's signed a corporate ground lease for the location in 2006 and recently committed to the location by extending the lease through 2027. Annual store sales for 2021 jumped 11% from 2020 and represent a rent-to-sales ratio of 5%. The lease calls for rent at 5% of store sales based on monthly sales reporting. This advantageous clause will allow the owner to benefit as the store's sales continue to increase from 2020 and 2021. The property is located in The Shops of Fallen Timbers lifestyle center in Maumee, Ohio, a suburb of Toledo. The largest of its kind serving the region, Fallen Timbers includes national tenants such as Rave Cinemas (14 screens), Dillard's, The University of Toledo Medical Center, Staybridge Suites, Barnes & Noble, American Eagle, Aeropostale, Red Robin, and more.



GREATER TOLEDO AREA

Toledo is the county seat of Lucas County, Ohio, and is a major port city in the Midwestern US. Toledo is the fourth-most populous city in the state after Columbus, Cleveland, and Cincinnati, and according to the 2020 census, the 79th-largest city in the United States. With a population of 270,871 it is the principal city of the Toledo metropolitan area. It also serves as a major trade center for the Midwest; its port is the fifth busiest in the Great Lakes and 54th biggest in the United States. The city was founded in 1833 on the west bank of the Maumee River, and originally incorporated as part of Monroe County, Michigan Territory. It was re-founded in 1837, after the conclusion of the Toledo War, when it was incorporated in Ohio. The first of many glass manufacturers arrived in the 1880s, eventually earning Toledo its nickname: "The Glass City." It has since become a city with a distinctive and growing art community, auto assembly businesses, education, thriving healthcare, and well-supported local sports teams. Downtown Toledo has been subject to major revitalization efforts, allowing a bustling entertainment district.






P.F.Chang's

P.F. Chang's is an Asian restaurant concept founded on making food from scratch every day in every restaurant. Created in 1993 by Philip Chiang and Paul Fleming, P.F. Chang's is the first multi-unit restaurant concept in the U.S. to honor and celebrate the 2,000-year-old tradition of wok cooking as the center of the guest experience. Since inception, P.F. Chang's chefs have been hand-rolling dim sum, hand chopping and slicing all vegetables and meats, scratch cooking every sauce and wok-cooking each dish, every day in every restaurant. P.F. Chang's new Farm to Wok® menu highlights its wholesome, scratch-cooking approach and introduces new dishes and drinks for lunch, happy hour and dinner. In 2019, the company was sold to TriArtisan Capital Partners and Paulson & Co. for a reported \$700 million. Today, P.F. Chang's has over 300 restaurants across the globe including 100 in international markets under licensee agreements including Argentina, Aruba, Brazil, Canada, Costa Rica, South Korea, Mexico, Philippines, and the United Kingdom to name a few.

TOLEDO REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS


- · A Triple-A Detroit Tigers affiliate, the Toledo Mud Hens have been around since 1896. These days the team plays downtown at Fifth Third Field, regularly called one of the best minor league parks in America.
- · In recent years Toledo's Warehouse District has reinvented itself as an entertainment hotspot with a revitalized modern-industrial look. The Warehouse District's renaissance was partially set in motion by the Toledo Mud Hens' move there in 2002.
- The Toledo Museum of Art has been around since the turn of the 20th century, and has since seen some major developments since, including a Frank Gehry-designed Center for the Visual Arts and the Glass Pavillion, an acclaimed piece of architecture, plus gallery space, classes, and artist studios.
- Toledo's Huntington Center is a new multipurpose \$100 million venue which opened its doors in 2009. In addition to serving as the new home of the Toledo Walleye of the East Coast Hockey League and the new home of the allfemale Toledo Crush football team, in addition to hosting major national performing artists.

- The Toledo Zoo was named "Best U.S. Zoo" by U.S.A Today earlier this year. It started in 1900 with a woodchuck donation, and has since expanded to include 9,000 animals of 800 species, including bald eagles, polar bears, and hippos.
- Jeep Wranglers and Cherokees are manufactured by the thousands at Chrysler's Toledo Complex, which has been open since 1910, and General Motors' Toledo facility produces transmissions for GM products.
- Toledo is home to two major fouryear college spots. The University of Toledo is located in the Ottawa neighborhood, and is known for research, medicine and engineering. Bowling Green State University, in the city of Bowling Green, is known for psychology and green energy research. Both are fairly large, with around 20,000 students, and have DI sports teams that go head-tohead in the Mid American Conference.
- The Toledo Speedway is a major regional sports value which features Automobile Racing Club of America events, National Midget and Sprint tour events and more throughout the year. They even host a school bus race called Night of Destruction School Bus Figure 8, which is as incredible and completely ludicrous as it sounds.




















5 MILE RADIUS DEMOGRAPHICS
