

Dollar General Takes 'First Major Step' Toward Expanding Healthcare Products in Stores

Dollar General may have taken the its first step toward adding pharmacy services to its stores, a move that could require the chain to reshuffle some real estate.

The Goodlettsville, Tennessee-based retailer said it will increase healthcare offerings in its 17,426 stores in 46 states. The move includes cough and cold, dental, nutritional, medical, health aids and feminine hygiene products. Dollar General said it has hired as **chief medical officer** Dr. Albert Wu, who worked for five years at consulting firm McKinsey & Co. and led a team that created a total cost-of-care model for 250,000 rural healthcare patients.

Dollar General is just the latest national chain to expand into healthcare, a move that has the potential to boost foot traffic at its stores.

Most of Dollar General's stores are in rural areas, and the retailer often notes that **75%** of the U.S. population lives within **about 5 miles** of a Dollar General store.

While Dollar General is **increasing its healthcare** products, drugstore chains Walgreens and CVS are moving into healthcare services. Walgreens is opening **primary-care clinics** with Chicago-based VillageMD in a quest to become a neighborhood health destination. For its part, CVS has been adding HealthHubs and MinuteClinics in stores.

Todd Vasos, Dollar General's CEO, said in the company's statement that "our customers have told us that they would like to see **increased access** to affordable healthcare products and services in their communities" and that the retailer's goal is to "build and enhance affordable **healthcare offerings** for our customers, especially in the rural communities we serve."







Barnesville is a city in Lamar County, Georgia, United States. The city is a part of the Atlanta Metropolitan Area.

As of the 2010 census, the city had a population of 6,755. The city is the county seat of Lamar County.

Barnesville was once dubbed the "Buggy Capital of the South" as the town produced about 9,000 buggies a year around the turn of the 20th century.

Each year in the third week of September the town hosts an annual Buggy Days celebration. Barnesville was founded in 1826 and named for local tayern owner Gideon Barnes.

In 1920, Barnesville was designated seat of the newly formed Lamar County.

Barnesville served as a major hospital site for wounded southern troops during the Civil War. Local families took wounded soldiers into their homes and treated them, with highly successful recovery rates. Major General William B. Bate, CSA of Hardees Corps., wounded in Atlanta at Utoy Creek on August 10, 1864, was treated here. After the war, General Bate was elected Governor of Tennessee and served in the United States Senate until his death in 1912. He commented on his successful recovery as a result of the kindness of the local populace in Barnesville Barnesville is a great place to live, work and raise a family. Located in West Central Georgia, approximately 50 miles south of Atlanta and 30 miles north of Macon, Barnesville offers the charm of small town living with access to the conveniences of major metropolitan cities.

\$6.5 billion worth of investments planned for downtown Atlanta over 5 years

Downtown officials shared a new investment map that outlined \$6.5 billion going towards south downtown over the next five years.

"This investment is really bringing retail. It's bringing restaurants. It's bringing better public and green space for folks to enjoy on their lunch break or in between meetings," said Alena Green, Director of Economic Development Central Atlanta Progress. Green compiled this data from public and private projects either just finished, underway, or planned in south Atlanta in 65 acres of downtown Atlanta.

In the next 5 years, downtown Atlanta is expected to deliver double the amount of housing it delivered in the previous five years, according to Central Atlanta Progress.

She said many new complexes will have nearly a quarter of dedicated affordable units. She added that there are already signs that the downtown core has revitalized substantially since the peak of the pandemic.

Green said traffic is up 50% year-to-year. In Summerhill, which has seen significant recent development, some neighbors said they're concerned this growth prioritized the well-off.

"I feel like if I work here, I should be able to live here as well in the city," said Messiah Jones. "I shouldn't have to stay on the outskirts and work in the city," Jones said.



Georgia continues to set job creation, investment records

Georgia keeps setting records for jobs created and investment in spite of the pandemic, Pat Wilson, the Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Economic Development, told the Sandy Springs Perimeter Chamber of Commerce on June 14.

Wilson, who lives with his family just south of the Perimeter in Sandy Springs, spoke at the chamber's monthly luncheon, which was held at City Springs. He said officials thought they'd never break that record. But through three quarters of this fiscal year, the state has had 35,000 jobs announced and \$12.9 billion in investments in 251 new locations.

> In 2021, the state had its best year ever to that point, with 33,400 job announcements and approximately \$11 billion of investment.

"Georgia's economy is roaring, and the great thing about this is it is literally in every corner of the state," Wilson said. Wilson said whether it's Sandy Springs, Savannah or Dalton, something makes the community unique. The thread that connects these communities is growing jobs, which can be in any area, including tourism, the arts, film business recruitment or international trade.


The economic impact of the state's film tax credit was approximately \$240 million annually when it was first created. In 2021, companies spent \$4 billion in the film industry, he said. And 60,000 jobs in the state are connected to the industry.

He said inflation has affected investment. The investment dollars may be going up because companies worry about the workforce meeting their job demands, so they are automating more than ever.
